Navajo County Drug Project launches a youth art contest themed around its 2010 underage drinking (UAD) awareness slogan: "Alcohol is a Drug, too!" Navajo County youth ages 6 to 18 are invited to participate by submitting multi media artwork designed to print on a red t-shirt or on pages of a 2010-11 school calendar. Winners are eligible for cash prizes up to \$150 and art placement on t-shirts, calendar and print materials during the 2010-11 (UAD) campaign year. All participants will receive a participation gift. The top three winners will be recognized in an award event.

Minimum original artwork submission size is 8x11" in any reproducible medium. All submissions must include the UAD theme or slogan. Group/class submissions are accepted. Deadline is April 15, 2010. Winners will be announced by April 30. All submissions must be accompanied by an application signed by parent/guardian, listing teacher contact information. Submissions become the property of Navajo County Drug Project unless accompanied by a self-addressed, stamped envelope for return.
